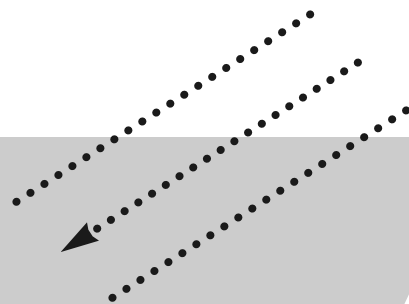

When It's Important To Tell

No child wants to be labeled as a big mouth or tattletale. But should they tell? When? Tell who? What if they promised not to tell? Doubts about telling can be troubling for young children. Doubts intensified by peer pressure can be tragic.

In this ethnically diverse video program young children will have an opportunity to see examples of when it's important to tell created from their social, family and school environments. In each vignette the children will see the importance of being personally responsible for themselves and the welfare of others. A wonderful springboard for teaching children the importance of sharing what they see, hear, or know.

Hey! That's Not Fair

An especially difficult concept for children to comprehend, the three age identifiable and dramatic vignettes will clearly bring focus to a child's concept of what constitutes fairness.

The Problem With Problems

Problems improperly solved or problems left unresolved will often result in even more serious problems. Created from children's schools, social and home settings, these three vignettes will provide skills for successfully dealing with the road blocks of social living.

When Things Don't Go My Way

Many children think that things should just go their way. Our young narrator in each of the 3 vignettes in this ethnically diverse video reinforces skills for youngsters to call upon when they must deal with the disappointment of things not going their way.

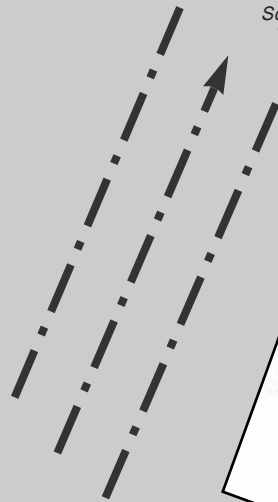
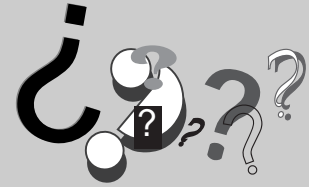

When I Feel Afraid!

When we are afraid it can be a paralyzing feeling - like when we're afraid of getting beat up, afraid when parents fight or afraid of what others might think of us.

When I Feel Alone!

When I Feel Jealous!

Jealousy is a difficult feeling to recognize and we often mistake it for anger like when mom's new boyfriend is around, or the most popular kid at school seems stuck-up or even when people make us share things we want.

It seems important to be just like everyone else, but feeling different can sometimes allow us to feel special. The differences explored are: socio-economic, physical and ethnic.

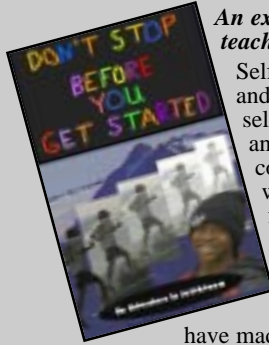
Do You Know You're GREAT?

Don't Stop Before You Get Started

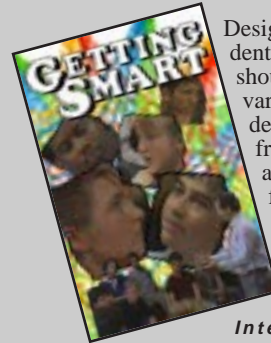


An exciting video that will teach kids positive self-esteem.

Getting Smart: Staying One Step Ahead of the Bully

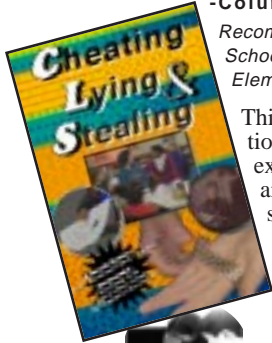


Designed to help students anticipate what should be done in a variety of situations dealing with confrontation. Children are living with the fear that today may be the day *the bully picks on me.*

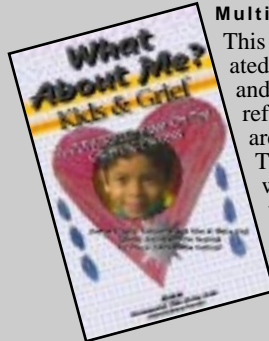
